Our current school population is at about 1350 students. Here's a breakdown of who's who:

- Almost 100 students are participating in our International Student Program
- 12 different countries are represented including Italy, Brazil, Korea, Germany, China, Vietnam, Thailand, and Colombia to name a few!

- 150 students identify as Indigenous
- Besides English, the top languages spoken at home by our students and families are:
 - Punjabi (307 families),
 - Spanish (59 families),
 - Arabic (48 families),
 - · Vietnamese (25 families),
 - and Tagalog (23 families).

Our commitment to Truth and Reconciliation is not a destination but a process and a journey through learning. It is a commitment to provide space for healing, building bridges, and forging connections throughout generations. In collaboration with our Indigenous Support Workers and Teachers for Indigenous Success, students will have opportunities this week to find meaningful ways to honour Indigenous peoples, create environments of inclusivity and respect, and show their commitment to truth and reconciliation.

The commitment to learning does not stop with our students, however. On Pro-D Day Friday, September 27th, Abby Senior staff will engage in a day of professional learning with Dr. Gwendolyn Point, Knowledge Keeper and Cultural Advisor who will share the history of local territory. They will hear from Brenda Morgan, Councillor of Mathxwí First Nation who will share about the generational impact of residential schools. Staff will also have the opportunity to hear from Chris Silver, Councillor of Semá:th First Nation will share about the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP), and Pixie Wells, president of the Fraser Valley Métis Association will share about Métis and Two-Spirited Identity.
