Tutorial Time

This Friday will be our first Tutorial block of the school year. Tutorial will fall immediately after first period (block A). A few things about Tutorial Time:

- Tutorial is instructional time and students are to be in a designated learning space.
- Students may only attend tutorials of classes they are enrolled in for this semester.
- Students are expected to have a plan and communicate this with their teachers
- Teachers have the right to hold students in their spaces for Tutorial Time to complete extra work, rewrite tests, complete missing assignments, etc.
- Students with a first period study, with parent permission, can stay home until the end of tutorial time.
- This is a gift of time for students. Effective use of this time can take you from a pass to a fail, from a 67% to a 75%. This is time set aside for you to complete work, ask questions, and ensure you are on track to do your best in each of your classes.
